The MEBENZADOLE Protocol

(This protocol should be accompanied and taken in conjunction with The Panacur Fenbenzadole and Boron-Borax Protocol)

Mebendazole:

A Cancer Fighting Drug We Can Find at the Pharmacy

Mebendazole is an Anthelmintic medication that has been used since the early 1970s to treat a range of parasitical worm infections, including threadworm, tapeworms, roundworms, and other nematode and trematode infections in humans and domestic animals.

What are Mebendazole's strong points are:

- It has high potential for serious effectiveness against cancer;
- Supported by both a large number of scientific publications (Ref.); and
- Clear case reports in humans, where, Mebendazole alone was effective in inducing cancer regression, in cancer patients with adrenal cancer (Ref.) and colorectal cancer (Ref.), not responding anymore to conventional treatment methods;

Mechanism:

- brain cancer, medulloblastoma, glioblastoma (Ref.1, Ref.2, Ref.3, Ref.4)
- melanoma (Ref.1, Ref.2, Ref.3)
- head and neck squamous cell carcinoma (HNSCC) (Ref.)
- cholangiocarcinoma or bile duct cancer (Ref.)
- gastric cancer (Ref.)
- breast cancer (Ref.)
- lung cancer (Ref.1, Ref.2)
- ovarian (Ref.)
- leukemia (Ref.) acute myeloid leukemia (AML) (Ref.)
- pancreatic cancer (Ref.)
- fibrosarcoma (Ref.)

A study, showed a high level of activity against leukaemia, colon cancer, CNS and melanoma cell lines, with lesser activity in breast, ovarian, renal and NSCLC lines (Ref.).

Based on all the research available, one might expect the highest chance of effectiveness of Mebendazole, against:

- adrenal cancer,
- colon and colo-rectal cancer,
- brain cancer,
- melanoma and
- leukemia

and possibly with other types cancer such as:

- pancreatic cancer
- lung cancer
- ovarian,
- breast,
- bile duct,
- gastric.

Dosage:

Take 1 x 100mg tablet every day for 9 consecutive days in every month.

Repeat this protocol every month.

Some experts state that Vermox is the most reliable source of mebenzadole as all scientific studies used the Vermox brand.

Protocol:

General Maintenance Dose:

Take 1 x 100mg tablet with a fatty meal twice per day for 9 consecutive days in every month. Repeat this protocol every month.

NOTE: If you suffer any healing crisis symptoms take Charcoal (2-4 capsules a day):

Charcoal is a pre-eminent detoxifier and when taken on an empty stomach, works its way down into the intestines and activates a blood purification process known as "interstitial dialysis". Charcoal is available from local pharmacy, Health Food Shop or even the New World Supermarket.

Cancer Protocol:

Research findings suggests the following:

According to a World Health Organisation reference (Ref.) cited by the Anticancer Fund (Ref.), a person could take up to:

40–50 milligrams per kilogram of body weight per day taken with a fatty meal for at least 3–6 months.

Another reference in terms of maximum dosage feasible is that used for alveolar echinococcosis and for patients with inoperable disease (Ref.), wherein:

40–50 milligrams per kilogram of body weight per day taken with a fatty meal has been used for treatment of an extended length of two years without issue, and possibly longer for patients with an inoperable disease.

Based on the above research, a person of 50kg could take up to 2.5 grams (2,500 milligrams) of Mebendazole for a period of months to years with no reported side effects.

Following the above research, it is suggested that one could:

- 1. It is recommended to always commence any new protocol with a low dose of Mebendazole and go up incrementally, step by step to the desired target dose.
- 2. Take the daily dose split into two, during or just after breakfast and dinner.
- 3. If your target dose is very high, it would be necessary to split the dosage to increments of three times per day.

Notes to be added:

According to research literature, some people may absorb better Mebendazole compared to another. This may also lead to a different effectiveness of Mebendazole in different people.

There was a clinical trial at John Hopkins Hospital, involving Mebendazole for brain cancer patients who were administered 3x500mg/day with meals, on a 28 day cycle (Ref.).

Janssen Pharma Vermox Product description states confidently the following regarding dose: "In controlled safety studies, humans have received from 100 to 1200 mg of mebendazole daily for up to 14 days with no reported side effects."
